



2018 Nebraska SuperTech Competition Winners

Morgan Barnes of Truck Center Companies – Norfolk is the 2018 Nebraska SuperTech Champion. More than 100 competitors registered to take the qualifying online, ASE-style test. The top 16 from the online test advanced to the hands-on skill stations final round hosted by Central Community College in Hastings, NE on July 19.

As the Nebraska 2018 SuperTech winner, Barnes will receive transportation and lodging to represent Nebraska at the National SuperTech competition September 16 – 20 in Orlando, FL. The competition is hosted by the American Trucking Associations’ Technology and Maintenance Council. The runner-up was Joel Kaup of Truck Center Companies – York and third place was Jeremiah Dasovic of Truck Center Companies - Omaha. Additional winners won cash prizes including station winners.
